ArtWorks at The Mill - and beyond!

In the past few months many of you enjoyed the exhibitions on Walthamstow Marshes and Fabric Art and if you haven't already seen it do check out *Book Marks* on till November the 23rd.

We have had two exhibitions of amazing sculptures: *WildLife REworked* - 15 urban animals made by local families with artist Michelle Reader, and *Waiting* - six plaster people created by Esther Neslen.

Both these exhibitions went on to other venues - the animals looked great in the garden at Vestry House and three of Esther's figures are currently sitting patiently in reception at the Town Hall. Quite an honour!

The sculptures inspired junior and adult poets and the result is an anthology *joined up writing* which was launched on Nov 2nd as part of *O My Word*.
